19th Annual Online Auction a Huge Success

The 19th Annual 2009 Idaho Fish and Wildlife Foundation annual online auction netted more than \$13,000 for "Be Outside!", The Idaho Children in Nature Network, connecting children with the outdoors. Please visit www.beoutsideidaho.org

Eleven days of bidding kicked off at a rapid pace with the first bid coming in one minute after the auction opened. The last winning bid was made two minutes before the auction closed. One hundred registered online bidders from eight different states bid on 40 incredible Idaho wildlife adventures.

Bidders from Idaho, Washington, Oregon, Nevada, New York, Pennsylvania, Arizona and Virginia all jumped into the excitement with the hope of winning a fabulous Idaho adventure.

Trips included a scenic Teton getaway, harlequin duck survey, upland game bird hunt and bird surveys of the Salmon-Challis National forest and many more.

Outdoor Central/Active Network's major sponsorship and those individuals and businesses listed on page 3 made this year's on-line auction the most successful to date.

Cheryl and Steve recently returned from their Idaho Fish and Game sage grouse lek count trip. Leks are traditional breeding grounds where the male sage grouse "struts his stuff" in preparation for mating. Sage grouse return to the same leks year after year, allowing biologists to obtain a population count.

Cheryl said it was fascinating to watch, and is looking forward to their second auction adventure, Pend Oreille Lake trout management trip.

Interview with Al VanVooren, Board Member

How long have you been involved with the Idaho Fish and Wildlife Foundation?

I'm a newbie on the Board, just completing my first year. But working in various positions for Idaho Fish and Game from 1985 to 2006, I had been familiar and somewhat involved with the Foundation since its inception.

What motivated you to join the Idaho Fish and Wildlife Foundation Board?

I just retired in 2006, and working with the Foundation was appealing as a way to stay involved in wildlife conservation. I'm frankly humbled by the talented people on the Board and their passion for wildlife conservation, but felt I might be able to help evaluate the ultimate wildlife benefits of the various projects and proposals that the Board considers.

What do you see as the Foundation's priorities and future goals?

I think one of the greatest strengths of the Foundation has been its ability to keep its priorities focused on activities that promote its mission (to protect and sustain Idaho's fishing, hunting and wildlife heritage). Another major strength is its ability to take action and make things happen without the "process paralysis" of government. I guess my personal bias is toward efforts that help educate and promote a public interest in wildlife and its needs – efforts that make all Idahoans feel they are stewards of our wildlife.

What are your hobbies and interests?

Spending time with my two sons and waiting for one of my daughters-in-law to tell me I'm going to be a grandfather. But outdoor activities have always been major interests: horse trips into the backcountry with my family, bow hunting, duck hunting, fishing and rafting. Since retiring, I've really enjoyed the opportunity to do more traveling.

What is your favorite outdoor experience or activity?

I don't think I can pick a favorite, but taking people fishing who don't normally have the opportunity – especially kids - is right up there.

If you were talking to someone who had never been to Idaho, what would you tell them about our state's wildlife and lands?



That Idaho has an unparalleled diversity of wildlife and landscapes. It's hard for people from most of the rest of the country to comprehend the spectrum of habitats and fish and wildlife that exist here. To people involved in wildlife conservation in other parts of the country I've stressed that while their efforts focus on trying to restore what once was, in Idaho we still have it and our focus is on keeping it.

What is your professional background?

I worked in state fish and wildlife conservation for 38 years before retiring in 2006. I had worked in Ohio on Lake Erie and in Iowa on the Mississippi doing fish research and management before coming to Idaho in 1985, where I held positions in fisheries and administration.

What is your favorite Foundation project?

The MK Nature Center in Boise. Working at Fish and Game headquarters, I was able to watch it literally grow from the ground up. I was able to watch thousands of kids and the entire community develop an ownership in it and, in turn, an ownership in Idaho's wildlife. None of that would have happened without the Foundation's involvement.
